The Disk transmitters are available in two different frequencies; 215 MHz and 216 MHz. The Disk transmitters have been approved and certified for use by Federal Communications Commission and Industry Canada in each of the frequencies.

The versatility of these transmitters allows for backward compatibility with all Locator Systems Corporation equipment. Therefore law enforcement and search & rescue agencies purchasing the equipment can be confident it will be compatible for many years.

Both the new Disk and the Traditional transmitters employ 3-stage technology. They transmit a unique ID which allows for full verification during the search process. The new Disk transmitter is intended for use in the Project Lifesaver waterproof plastic case. The replaceable battery lasts 30 days.

“As the user base for Project Lifesaver continues its rapid growth, the demands for different transmitter styles and options, are also increasing. We wanted to provide the same high quality transmitter with a different form factor in an effort to meet the end users demands,” said Jim McIntosh, CEO of Locator Systems.
